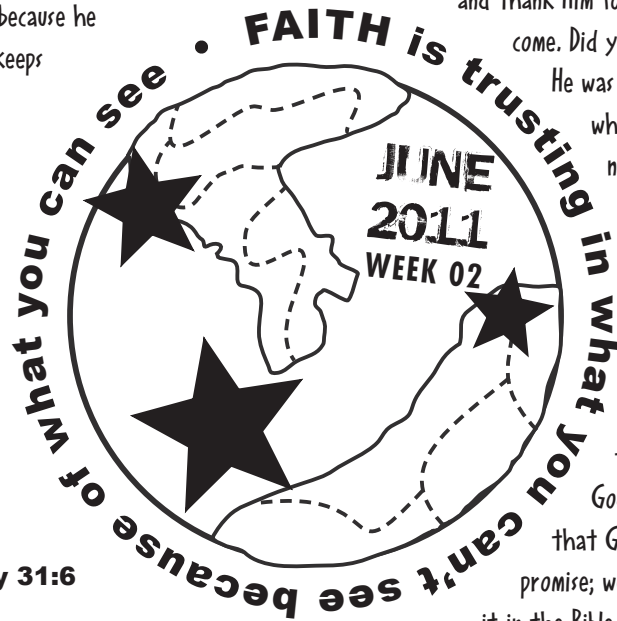

Last week you learned the definition of faith. And then you wrote your own. Remember it? Remembering is so important. Even though Abraham had a lot of faith in God, he still messed up sometimes, usually because he forgot that God keeps His promises.

Read these promises from God and memorize at least three of them:

- Deuteronomy 31:6**
- Isaiah 30:21**
- Isaiah 40:29**
- Jeremiah 29:11**
- Matthew 28:20**
- John 10:27-28**
- John 16:33**
- 1 John 1:9**

TELL God how grateful you are that He speaks, listens, and keeps His promises.



Read Genesis 12:7.

When Abraham got to Canaan and he heard God's promise, he built an altar, a place where he could worship God and thank Him for what was to come. Did you catch that?

He was praising God for what God would do, not just what He had done. At that point God hadn't made His promise come true. But Abraham trusted that God would. (We know that God kept His promise; we can read about it in the Bible.)

How about making something to remember the promises you learned about yesterday? ○ Go outside and make an altar. ○ Stack some rocks or make something from sticks. ○ Go back to your altar daily and thank God for what He has promised YOU!

THANK God that He keeps all the promises He makes to you.

Read Ephesians 2:12-13.

If you forget everything else, remember the most important promise God has ever made. Before we make the choice to trust Jesus, we are totally confused, totally sinful, totally separated from Him. But when we ask Jesus to be our Savior, we'll have a life that lasts forever. Every wrong thing we have done or ever will do will be forgiven. This is God's most amazing and important promise to you. And He kept it when He sent us Jesus.
